The Partnerships for Healthy Communities: Child Abuse Intervention and Prevention course was designed to educate pre-hospital and hospital personnel on how to recognize signs of child abuse, document their findings, report suspicions, and prevent child abuse

- How to report your suspicions of child abuse to authorities in order to fulfill your legally mandated requirement
- How to prevent child abuse by applying prevention strategies to every 911 call
